MINING CALENDAR ART COMPETITION – TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Instructions on how to enter and other details contained within promotional advertisements for this competition form part of the conditions of entry.
2. By entering the competition, entrants agree to abide by these Terms and Conditions.
3. The Terms and Conditions of this competition are governed by the laws of the State of Western Australia.
4. The competition is being run by Curtin University, GPO Box U1987, Perth, Western Australia, 6845 ("Curtin").
5. The Mining Calendar Art Competition ("the competition") commences at 8:00am Australian Western Standard Time (AWST) on Saturday, 1 July 2017.
6. The closing time for entering the competition is 2:00pm AWST on Friday, 18 August 2017.
7. Entry to the competition is limited to participating local Goldfields schools in W.A.
8. Competition is voluntary, and run by the teachers at the local schools.
9. Goldfields Education Mining Industry Alliance ("GEMIA") are assisting with coordination - with any profits from the calendar sales returned to GEMIA.
10. To enter the competition, the entrant must:
 - Be an enrolled student of a local participating Goldfields school in W.A,
 - Provide an original piece of artwork created by the student of the participating school, the artwork must be hand drawn or painted in colour on the entry form printed on A4 white paper,
 - The artwork must relate to the topic and be 'mining related',
 - The artwork must be submitted to their requesting teacher prior to the submission end date of 2:00pm on Friday, 18 August 2017.
11. Entry to the competition is free. Entrants will be responsible for all costs associated with entering the competition, which may include costs associated with accessing the internet.
12. Entrants may only enter the competition once.
13. Staff employed by Curtin and their immediate family members are not eligible to enter the competition.
14. There will be 12 prizes consisting of a \$75 gift card to each winning artist from each school grade for each month and the winning artist's classroom will receive a small party to the value of \$125.00.
15. Each participating school grade will select the best three entries and these will be judged by a panel of judges nominated by WASM comprising of nominated teachers (one per school) and a nominee from CME, GEMIA and the mayor's office. A nominee from WASM will Chair the Judges Committee but will be non-voting.
16. Each participating school grade will select the best three entries and these will be exhibited in the WA School of Mines Graduate Hall, Kalgoorlie Campus on Thursday, 7 September 2017. The panel of judges will select the winning entries.
17. Decisions of judges is final.
18. The prize winners will be notified on Thursday, 31 August 2017 by the relevant judging teacher of their school.
19. Winners release any copyright on their entry to the WA School of Mines to use freely. Artwork will be retained and become the property of WASM. By entering the competition you grant permission for your full name to be published.
20. If the prize winner is under the age of 18 years, the prize will be awarded to the winner's parent or legal guardian.
21. The prize may be collected in person by the prize winner or parent/legal guardian from the participating school's nominated teacher who attends the judging.
22. The prize winner, or if under the age of 18 years, their parent or legal guardian, may be required to provide evidence of their identity (such as photographic ID, birth certificate or current passport) when receiving the prize.
23. The prize winner will be responsible for all costs associated with collecting and using the prize.
24. By entering the competition the entrant agrees that they are over the age of 18 years, or if under the age of 18 years, have their parent's or legal guardian's consent to enter the competition.
25. The prize is not redeemable for cash or an alternative prize.
26. The prize is not transferrable.
27. The prize winner's name will be published on the Curtin website. By entering the competition, entrants grant Curtin permission to use their full name and suburb on its website for up to six months from the date of the draw.
